Christian Science Church, Douglas

This small instrument, with was made up from parts of 2 or 3 redundant organs, in the 1970s. It has an electro-pneumatic mechanism, stands in a purpose made gallery and was installed by Jeffrey Heard, the son of one of the church members, who specialises in the electrical side of organ-building, working free-lance for organ-builders in the UK and abroad.

The instrument was completed by Peter

Jones, who added 3 ranks of pipes to the Great, being a gift of the late Eric G. Widdowson, who left the Church his small home practice organ. These 3 ranks (Stopped Diapason, Flute and Fifteenth) were revoiced so as to balance the larger number of stops on the Swell. The console of this very serviceable little organ is situated at the front of the building, with the organ gallery on the back wall.
