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Statement of Committee's responsibilities

Charity law requires the Committee to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and of the surplus or deficit of the Charity for that year. In preparing those financial statements, the Committee are required to select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently.

The Committee are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Registration Act and Regulations. They have general responsibility for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the assets of the Charity and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.



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Report of the Independent Auditors to the Committee of The Manx Heritage Foundation Fund ("the Charity")

We have audited the financial statements on pages 3 to 9.

This report is made solely to the Committee, as a body. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to them those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the Charity and the Committee as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

Respective responsibilities of the Committee and Auditors

As described on page 1 the Committee are responsible for the preparation of financial statements in accordance with applicable Isle of Man law. Our responsibilities, as independent auditors, are, established in the Isle of Man by statute, the Auditing Practices Board and by our professions ethical guidance.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the documents constituting the charity.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Committee in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Charity's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

Opinion

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity as at 31 March 2004 and of the surplus for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the provisions of the documents constituting the Charity.

1 Accounting policies

a) Accounting convention

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

b) Income

Donations, grants and bank interest are accounted for on a receipts basis.

c) Publications

Commercial sales of publications are included in the income and expenditure account net of the related production costs.

d) Depreciation

Fixed assets are shown at cost and are depreciated on a straight line basis over five years with a full years' depreciation being charged in the year of purchase and no charge in the year of sale.

e) Stock

Stock is carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

2 Taxation

No provision for Manx income tax is provided for in these financial statements as the charity is registered as a Charitable Organisation.
