
Flitters

- Diary writing
 Imagine you live one hundred years ago. You
 have been down the beach taking part in the
 flitter celebration on Good Friday. Write your
 diary describing what you did throughout the day.
 Remember to include as much detail about the
 tradition as possible.
- Persuasive writing
 Write a letter to your local MHK persuading them that bringing back old Manx traditions like flitter collecting is important. Persuade them that preserving traditional Manx culture is a good thing to do.
- Instruction writing Write some instructions about how to collect and cook flitters in the traditional Manx way.
- Write a short play about the tradition of collecting and cooking flitters on Good Friday. Perform your play.
